This study discusses the analysis of the types of slang and the meaning of slang. In addition, this research also has a contribution to the teaching of English. The purpose of this study is to find slang and its types in “The Hangover” movie. In this study, the author uses the theory of Allan and Burridge to analyze slang. To analyze slang words, the researcher pays attention to the conversations in the movie and subtitles and classifies each slang into the types according to the theory used. In the results of this study, researchers found 45 slang words. There are 45 slang divided into five types. In the Fresh ad Creative type, there is 14 slang, 15 are in the Flippant, 9 in Imitative, there is only 1 in Acronym, and 6 in the Clipping type. The study results concluded that the slang used is more dominant to the Flippant type, with data on 15 slang in this type.

In society, language is often used in various contexts and has many meanings. The function of language is as a means of communication and interaction. According to Allan and Burridge (2006), there are five types of slang that can be explained: fresh and creative, flippant, imitative, acronym, and clipping.

a. Fresh and Creative

The meaning is that slang has another vocabulary to portray something in an informal circumstance. Examples: "daddy" is used to addressing a man, especially an elder one. The other example of fresh and creative types are guys, bro, sist, dude, etc.

b. Flippant

In this sense, slang comprises two words or more, which does not connect with the denotative significance. For example, brass monkeys mean very cold. Then, get off my back, which means don't bother me.

Imitative implies that the slang word was mirroring or got from the Standard English word, utilizing the Standard English words in various significance or consolidating two other words. Examples are wanna, and this is the slang word got from the expression "want to." Then, the second example is gonna that derived from the words "going to." Slang words of "wanna" and "gonna" are commonly used by almost everyone.

d. Acronym

The point of an acronym is that the effect of the word comes from the primary letter of each word in an expression or utilizing initials from a group. The example, OTW, is an acronym of "On The Way."

e. Clipping

The last one is clipping which means that a slang word that comes from deleting some part of a more long word turns into a more limited structure in a similar meaning. The example, "dad," the point of "daddy," and "till" refers to "until."

Method

In this study, the writer will use qualitative methods to obtain the results of these data. The object of this study is the slang verbally expressed by every one of the actors in The Hangover film.

Researchers took this research resource using English subtitles, Indonesian subtitles, and film script, which has been downloaded on the internet to analyze slang.

The researchers observed data from the movie's dialogue, script, and subtitles to find data to be analyzed.

b. Data Listing

Researchers focus on understanding the meaning and types of slang to collect data to make classification easier.

c. Data Classification

In data analysis, researchers used several ways to analyze the slang in The Hangover movie. The researcher will watch and observe the film, the script and classify all the slang words in the movie. Discussion of the Findings

The researcher took several examples of the meaning and types of slang in the appendix of "The Hangover" movie to be discussed.

1. Fresh and Creative

a. Buddy

Data 1: All right, buddy.

Buddy means fellow. This word is usually used to address close friends or pal because their friendship is so close that they use it in their conversations.

b. Chick

Data 9: I need the chick. I need both parties.

In general, according to the Cambridge Dictionary, “chick” means a baby bird or young chicken, but in this conversation, the meaning is different. Based on the context and situation, the sense of the word chick is a young woman. In this conversation, the word chick is used in an informal case.

2. Flippant

a. Fucked up

Data 15: Yeah, listen, we fucked up.

From the data above, the word “fucked up” means disordered or thoroughly confused. This word shows that their condition or situation is not okay.

b. Wolf pack

Data 26: And my wolf pack, it grew by one.

When translated, the word “wolf pack” means a pack of wolves, but it has a different meaning in the conversation. In data 26 and according to the context of the conversation, the word “wolf pack” means a group of friends.

3. Imitative

a. Gonna

Data 30: I’m gonna cancel.

From data 30 shows, “I’m gonna cancel.” The researcher explained that the word “gonna” derives from a combination of two words (going + to), which means he is going to cancel from the data.

b. Wanna

Data 31: Yeah. You wanna explain it to them?

“Yeah. You wanna explain it to them?”. These are data 31, which contains the word “wanna.” “Wanna” is a slang word that is formed from two words (want + to). The sentence is intended to ask about what you want to explain to other members.

4. Acronym

a. SNAFU

Data 39: Well, there was a snafu when we stopped.

The word “SNAFU” is an acronym for Situation Normal, All Fucked Up. Based on the context and situation in the conversation, the term “SNAFU” has been appropriately used because they are not doing well in that condition. So this word is used in informal situations.

5. Clipping

a. Dad

Data 41: His legs look fine, Dad.

The word “dad” refers to “daddy,” so the term is used to address a father.

b. Congrats
